C. <u>2017 – 2018 Budget Process</u>

Mrs. Duran gave two hand outs in addition to the packet information. The first one identifying a number of items to consider for the budget this year:

- World Languages Teacher to be shared between middle and high school
- Addition of a Behavioral Specialist
- We have applied and hope to be accepted for a school bus. In addition, we are asking for a new handicap accessible van for \$55,000
- Replace a segment of the original wing of the elementary school roof for \$85,000
- Update the heating panel at the high school for \$69,000
- Terminals on wheels for each of the schools at \$10,000 each

The second handout from MSMA outlining the 48 proposed changes to the funding formula. This is a huge change and makes it nearly impossible to prepare the budget. We will continue to keep preparing the expenditures budget.

D. Jobs for Maine Graduates

Hermon High school is one of 5 high schools invited to join Jobs for Maine Graduates at no cost to us because they have a grant. It is a wonderful opportunity for our students. JMG will provide an instructor, we have to have a place for them and allow that individual to go to workshops. They would like 40 students, but would probably run it with 35. Hermon now qualifies for this program because it is now open up to and requires 40% of the students involved to have an IEP or 504. It includes internships, getting out and seeing businesses, writing skills development, preparing a resume, making out an application and soft skills. Mr. Walsh added that they would hire two Vocational Rehab counselors to work with just the 5 schools in the program. The cost now is \$25,000 and would not need to be paid until 4 years down the road. Mrs. Duran proposed that she would request RSU 87 split that cost.

Mr. Carr motioned, seconded by Mr. Harris to accept the invitation to participate in Jobs for Maine Graduates.

Item VIII: REPORTS

A. Principals

- In addition to their written reports, Mr. Walsh added the cheerleaders are doing fantastic and performed at a showcase on Saturday. They will be competing this upcoming Saturday at the Augusta Civic Center at 2:00 pm. Basketball is down to the wire with the potential of the boys being the first seed if they win against Houlton, and the girls being the 2nd seed if they win against Houlton.
- Mrs. Perry stated the first PreK-4 dance raised \$610 to be donated to the Lafayette Center and the Pennies for Patients Drive raised \$193.82.
- Mrs. Biberstein reported that 20 students qualified for regionals in track, one Hermon student swimming for John Bapst has qualified for States, as well as a Hermon student wrestler wrestling for Bucksport.

B. Superintendent

Mrs. Duran encouraged all to be vigilant making contacts regarding Betsy DeVos as the Education Secretary Nominee.

C. School Committee Follow-up and Request for Information

- Mr. Harris wanted to recognize Cameron Fowler for his 700 hours of voluntary service. He asked when the Building Committee meets next and gave a flyer on shelving available from USM. He also inquired about the process for hiring a new Football coach. Mrs. Biberstein stated that once the resignation letter was received, that the position was posted both in-house and on Serving Schools, and that it will be open until February 15th. At that time a hiring committee would be formed to look at the applications, and then interviews would be conducted.
- Mrs. Cowallis, referring to the Goals and Objectives mentioned RSU 87 discussed getting the two boards together and was asked to get ideas for what the conversation/agenda may look like. Their next meeting will be the first part of March.
- Mrs. Smith commended Mrs. Biberstein and Mr. Walsh on the sportsmanship she had noted at some of the games she'd attended. She is very excited for the opportunity for Jobs for Maine Graduates. She expressed a concern regarding unfunded mandates and asked for a breakdown for what it reimbursed either from the State or federally.
- Mr. Carr stated his sadness at the loss of Bill Laughlin, for whom the field hockey field was named after. He asked Mrs. Duran if she had decided on a name for the elementary school, and she indicated that she had decided on Patricia A. Duran.
- Mr. Reynolds mentioned the possibility of privatized special education and further cutting of funds to public schools. He mentioned things may change if Betsy Devos becomes the Secretary of Education.

D. Other

- Eric Byers, student representative, mentioned the new sign language club and a Neurology/Cardiology job shadow experience for the UTC Bridge Year.
- Michael Lana, student representative, stated that next week will be the Winter Carnival with a music theme.
