WINTER IS COMING: Winter weather is unpredictable and at times dangerous. Driving this time of year requires extra caution and attention. Be safe and enjoy the season. Gardner Construction is responsible for plowing most of the municipal roads and streets from Fuller Road to I-95. Fuller Road intersection toward Union Street and all of the side streets and roads off of Union Street are maintained by The Town of Hermon Public Works. If you have questions regarding plowing please call Ralph Shaw, Public Works Foreman @ 570-6494. Mailboxes are the responsibility of the property owner and they must be installed within USPS standards. The Town assumes no liability for mailboxes damaged during winter plowing operations.

<u>TAX BILLS</u> – the Town has once again kept the current mil-rate @ 11.99. per thousand dollars of property taxes. For every dollar raised .71 cents goes to the school department, .11 cents goes to Penobscot County and the other .18 cents goes to municipal operations such as fire, law enforcement services, public works, code enforcement, etc. I would like to thank Michael Chammings, Finance Director and Rylee Cushman, Assessor for putting together this year's tax commitment- it was great to see the teamwork required for this important part of our operation. I should be receiving your new tax bill by the end of the month.

Hermon partners with MaineDOT "BikePed" Program to fund safety improvements near Hermon Middle School...

The MaineDOT's federally-funded "Bike Ped" Program was created to help communities improve safety for pedestrians and bicyclists, and to provide options that relate to surface transportation under the eligible categories outlined under the FAST Act and prioritized by MaineDOT. The priorities include improved safety for walkers and bikers, safe routes to school for non-drivers, pedestrian and bicycle facilities and utilization of transportation corridors for bike/pedestrian trails including sidewalks and trails.

The BikePed Program principally supports locally-initiated projects that improve the community's transportation environment, economic vibrancy, safety for pedestrians and bicyclists, downtown revitalization initiatives and environmental mitigation. Hermon was awarded a funding opportunity to enhance safety, ADA accessibility, and efforts to ensure that school age children can safely access their schools and afterschool programs. The Hermon project will improve pedestrian safety with a cross-walk and sidewalk improvement from the Hermon Middle School property to Schoolhouse Lane.

MaineDOT annually allocates to the Bicycle and Pedestrian Program about \$3.0 million in federal funds for this statewide program. Each project has a 20% local match requirement with a maximum federal allocation of \$400,000 per project. Hermon's DECD office applied for the grant and was funded for preliminary engineering and initial right-of-way activities with \$68,000 in federal transportation funds with a local match of \$17,000. The full project estimate total contingent on MaineDOT receiving adequate federal funding for MaineDOT's 2022-23-24 Capital Work Plan is \$496,472.

The MaineDOT Municipal Partnership Program, Business Partnership Initiative Program, Federal Highway Safe Route to Schools Grant (FAST Act) and the MDOT Highway Safety Program has helped the Town of Hermon accomplish one of our identified goals of improving critical infrastructure in an efficient and cost effective way by leveraging locally administered project supervision using Federal and State dollars for community interest capital plans. Since 2016 improvements to "State Aid" and federal highway systems have totaled over \$6,855,937 dollars. Hermon's share for the period 2016 through FY 2023 equals \$1,917,680.
