### **GOOD NUMBERS FOR HERMON**

It's been a busy few months in the Legislature, but I'm proud to have taken actions that benefit our district, especially folks in Hermon.

The Town of Hermon and its schools stand to benefit from the recently passed continuing services budget that I supported and helped pass. Because of those efforts, in Fiscal Year 2026, Hermon will be receiving approximately \$810,000 from revenue sharing, which is almost \$80,000 more than last year. The State has also kept its promise of funding 55% of public school costs, so Hermon schools can expect to receive over \$8 million, another double-digit increase for Hermon.

My hope is that these funds can be used to further improve our school programs, keep our property taxes down, and continue to show what makes Hermon such a great place to live, work and raise a family. But the final decisions on at that funding are up to the Hermon Town Council and the Hermon School Committee – so let them know how you want it spent!

# Husson University Nursing Students Host Teddy Bear Clinic for Pre-Kindergarten Students

During the month of April, nursing students from Husson University visited our PreK classroom to conduct a "Teddy Bear Clinic," providing our young learners with a unique and educational experience.

During the clinic, each child brought their favorite stuffed animal to serve as a "patient." The nursing students guided the children through various medical procedures, such as checking vital signs, applying bandages, and listening to heartbeats using real medical equipment. This hands-on approach helped demystify medical processes and made the experience both engaging and informative.

The primary goal of the Teddy Bear Clinic was to familiarize our PreK students with medical procedures in a friendly and non-threatening environment. By role-playing as healthcare providers for their stuffed animals, the children gained a better understanding of what to expect during medical visits, which can help reduce anxiety and build trust in real-life healthcare situations.

This initiative aligns with research indicating that such clinics, led by nursing students, can significantly enhance health knowledge among preschool children and foster positive community relationships.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to the Husson University nursing students for their dedication and for creating a nurturing environment where our young learners could explore and learn about healthcare. Their efforts have undoubtedly made a lasting impact on our students' perception of medical care.









### **Budget process failed Maine again**

For the third state budget in a row, majority Democrats have used a constitutional loophole to circumvent the traditional bipartisan state budget process. To do this, they passed a majority budget, then adjourned (ended) the legislative session on March 21, months before the June 18 statutory adjournment date. Thousands of bills had not even been printed or acted upon. Governor Mills immediately called us back into special session citing extraordinary circumstances. Mainers deserve and should expect their leaders to behave better than this.

This constitutional loophole requires passing a "majority budget" in March, instead of the typical time in June. Passing it in June requires a two-thirds majority. It ensures that both Republicans and Democrats have a say in the final budget passed, making it a bipartisan endeavor. The Maine Constitution is set up to bring about this outcome. No one party should be able to completely ignore or override the other.

Democrats only passed part of a budget so they can claim that it does not raise the new or expanded taxes proposed by Governor Mills on pensions, tobacco products, cannabis, gallons of paint, drug prescriptions, ambulance services, and online streaming services. There will be tax increases later when the new revenue projections are made in May. Their budget does not fully fund MaineCare in year-2, it is short by \$122 million.

Remember that state government went from having projected surpluses to a shortfall in a few short years. One-party overspending has resulted a budget that increases approximately \$1.1 billion, going from \$10.5 billion to \$11.663 billion. Rather than reduce spending or find efficiencies, the budget freezes statutory cost of living payments to direct care workers and Maine hospitals that are already losing money. Your may have noticed that several more hospitals and medical facilities have closed.

It is increasingly apparent that the majority has no interest in hearing any opinions that differ from their own narrow agenda which ensures higher spending and higher taxes for Maine citizens.

I believe that both parties' voices should be heard to create a bipartisan budget that represents the values of all Mainers, not just those living in southern Maine. The traditional budget process that used to be the norm guarantees that outcome. Abandoning that process disenfranchised half of Maine out.

I will continue to advocate for transparent and collaborative work that addresses the problems that everyday Mainers face. There are many other important issues before the legislature. I look forward to hearing from during the next two years on state issues of interest to you, or matters concerning state agencies. Please contact me at <a href="maintenant-size-stat


We currently have 131 club members. If you are interested in joining please contact Byron at 207-852-8961.
