Recently, Hermon JROTC cadets completed CPR and First Aid certification training. Throughout the training process, cadets learned important life saving skills that could help us respond during emergencies both in school and in our community. During the certification, Hermon JROTC cadets practiced CPR techniques and the Heimlich maneuver, learned how to properly use first aid equipment, and worked through emergency response scenarios on both an adult and a baby. We were taught how to stay calm under pressure and how to help someone until professional medical help arrives. Cadets had to successfully complete both hands-on practice and the online portions in order to become certified.

For many of us, the training was both challenging and rewarding. It gave cadets the opportunity to build teamwork, leadership, and responsibility while also learning skills that can truly save lives. Hermon JROTC cadets took the process seriously and worked hard to earn these certifications. Programs like this show how JROTC prepares students for real world situations and encourages cadets to serve their community. By completing CPR and First Aid certification, we are now better prepared to help others in emergencies and become stronger leaders. Next up, JCLC (summer camp)!

achievements as they prepare to transition to middle school. We are incredibly proud of all they have accomplished and wish them continued success in the years ahead.

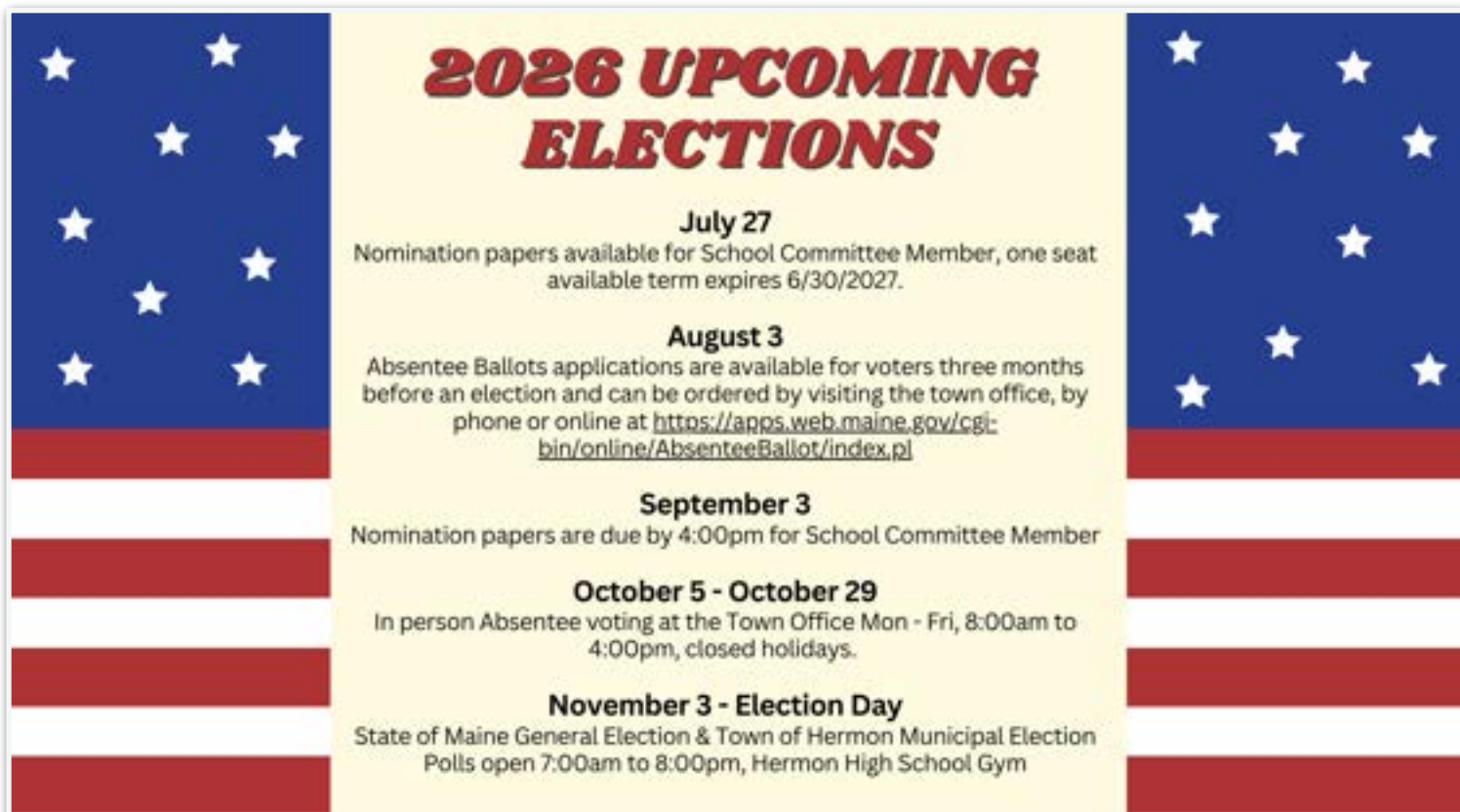

Research consistently shows that children who read during the summer maintain and strengthen their academic skills. According to the National Summer Learning Association, students who do not read over the summer can lose up to two months of reading achievement. Just 20 minutes of reading each day can help children build vocabulary, improve comprehension, and develop a lifelong love of learning.

We also encourage families to spend time outdoors and stay active. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends that children engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity each day. Regular outdoor play has been linked to improved physical health, stronger social skills, better mental well-being, and increased attention and focus when students return to school.

While we hope everyone enjoys a relaxing and fun-filled summer, we are already looking forward to welcoming students back in the fall. The first day of school for all students in PreK through Grade 4 will be **September 1**. Families should be on the lookout for information regarding our upcoming Open House, which will provide an opportunity to meet teachers, visit classrooms, and prepare for a successful start to the new school year.

Please be aware the deadlines for submission are due August 1 (Fall), November 1 (Winter), February 1 (Spring) and May 1 (Summer).

Once you have submitted your article, Town staff will be in contact with you to let you know if the article you submitted will be published. We look forward to hearing from you!

Honor Flight Maine: A Journey of Gratitude and Remembrance

Twice each year, in the spring and fall, Honor Flight Maine provides an unforgettable experience for Maine veterans by transporting them from Bangor International Airport to Washington, D.C., for a trip dedicated to honoring their service and sacrifice.

I had the personal honor of serving as a guardian for my father, Donald Shepley, during the May 2026 Honor Flight. It was a meaningful and emotional experience to accompany him on this journey and witness firsthand the respect, gratitude, and appreciation shown to our veterans throughout the entire trip.

Honor Flight Maine is part of a national network of nonprofit organizations whose mission is to recognize America's veterans by providing them with the opportunity to visit the memorials built in their honor. Priority is given to senior veterans, especially those who served during World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War, as well as veterans with terminal illnesses.

The day begins early at Bangor International Airport, where veterans are greeted by volunteers, family members, and

supporters who gather to send them off with heartfelt appreciation. Many veterans describe the departure as emotional, as they are surrounded by fellow service members and community members who recognize their contributions to our nation.

Upon arrival in the Washington, D.C. area, veterans visit some of the country's most significant military memorials and landmarks, including Fort McHenry, Arlington National Cemetery for the Changing of the Guard, the U.S. Marine Corps War Memorial, also known as the Iwo Jima Memorial, the U.S. Air Force Memorial, the Military Women's Memorial, the Korean War Veterans Memorial, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, the World War II Memorial, the U.S. Navy Memorial, and other national monuments.

For many participants, it is their first opportunity to see these memorials in person and reflect on their military experiences alongside fellow veterans.

One of the most memorable moments of the trip occurs upon the veterans' return to Maine. Family members, friends, and community supporters gather at Bangor International Airport to welcome them home. The reception often includes waving flags, cheering crowds, and heartfelt expressions of gratitude. Many veterans describe homecoming as one of the most meaningful experiences of their lives.

Honor Flight Maine operates entirely through donations and the dedication of volunteers. Veterans travel at no cost, thanks to the generosity of individuals, businesses, and organizations throughout the state. Volunteer guardians accompany veterans throughout the day, ensuring their comfort and safety while helping create a memorable experience.

The program serves as a powerful reminder of the sacrifices made by Maine's veterans and provides an opportunity for communities to express their appreciation in a meaningful way. Whether through volunteering, donating, or simply attending a welcome-home celebration, residents can play a role in honoring those who have served our country.

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America at 250: Honoring the Past, Building the Future

2026 Legislative Session Update with Rep. Jim Thorne, House District 35 – Carmel and Hermon

This year, Americans across the country are celebrating a milestone few nations ever reach—250 years since the signing of the Declaration of Independence.

For a quarter of a millennium, the United States has endured, grown, and prospered because generations of Americans have stepped forward to preserve and strengthen the freedoms we inherited. As we celebrate America's 250th birthday, we should ask ourselves what kind of legacy we will leave for future generations.

Will our children and grandchildren inherit a nation that is stronger, more prosperous, and more united? Will they enjoy the same opportunities that previous generations worked so hard to create? Will they understand the importance of personal responsibility, civic engagement, and service to others?

These are questions that transcend politics. They go to the heart of what it means to be an American.

One of the greatest strengths of communities like Hermon is that we still believe in the power of local action. We know that the future of our state and nation depends not only on decisions made in Augusta or Washington, but also on the choices we make every day as neighbors, parents, business owners, volunteers, and citizens.

The founders entrusted future generations with an extraordinary gift: a free and self-governing nation. For 250 years, Americans have worked to preserve that gift and pass it on.

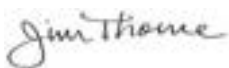
Now it is our turn.

Protecting Mainers' Access to Healthcare

The Maine Legislature officially adjourned in April, marking the end of my final term in Augusta. My colleagues and I have accomplished many things that I am deeply proud of, such as supporting educators and students, and bringing property tax relief to Mainers who need it most. I am particularly proud of the work we've done to preserve and protect Mainers' access to quality, affordable healthcare over the two years of the 132nd Legislature.

My colleagues and I passed significant investments in the State's healthcare infrastructure. We fully funded MaineCare, closing a projected funding gap that would have threatened access to essential services for thousands of Mainers, particularly low-income families, seniors, children and those with disabilities. We also increased funding for Maine's essential direct-care workforce by covering a larger percentage of the state's cost-of-living adjustment, which ensures that the workers who provide critical services to older Mainers and people with disabilities are fully compensated.

I'm also proud to have supported legislation that protects some of Maine's most at-risk populations. We passed laws ensuring that all Mainers – regardless of their income – can access financial aid when dealing with large hospital bills, helping protect families from the overwhelming impact of medical bills. Additionally, we secured funding for Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics, which serve anyone who requests care for mental health issues or substance use, regardless of their ability to pay. Furthermore, we protected Mainers by prohibiting debt collectors from garnishing wages or placing a lien on a home based on outstanding medical debt, making certain that Mainers don't lose income or their homes because of medical emergencies they could not have foreseen.

Serving the people of Bangor and Hermon in Augusta has been one of the greatest honors of my life. I will continue to serve you in any way I am able for the rest of my time here in office.
